God blesses those who are poor and realize their need for him, for the Kingdom of Heaven is theirs. Matthew 5:3

The only way to really understand and appreciate God's grace is to embrace the depth of your spiritual poverty and brokenness. By doing this, you'll come to realize how helpless you really are and how powerful God really is.

God blesses those who mourn, for they will be comforted. Matthew 5:4

In the midst of our mourning, we are able to let down our guard and remove the masks we are wearing. Once we mourn our sin and helpless, by realizing how it affects us and others... we can experience God's grace.

God blesses those who are humble, for they will inherit the whole earth. Matthew 5:5

Genuinely happy people are the ones who've learned how to manage their emotions and keep their strength (words and actions) under control.

God blesses those who hunger and thirst for justice, for they will be satisfied. Matthew 5:6

It's easy to hunger and thirst after justice for other people, but once we start to hunger and thirst after it for ourselves, we are filled. The turning point in this verse is that "justice" or "righteousness" is not a behavior, but rather the person of Jesus Christ.

God blesses those who are merciful, for they will be shown mercy. Matthew 5:7

Showing mercy to others, and extending forgiveness, is the only way to truly be free from hate, anger, bitterness and resentment.

God blesses those whose hearts are pure, for they will see God. Matthew 5:8

WHY A SPECIAL OFFERING?
